What is Research CA\$H?

Research CA\$H, or **Research Capacity, Access and Strength Here**, is an initiative presented by Hotiì ts'eeda and the Aurora Research Institute to provide researchers in the Northwest Territories with training and support to win federal funding to support their research.

How does this all work?

This website is home to a series of resources to help give you more information about research in the North, understanding funding programs offered by Tri-Council federal funding agencies (SSHRC, NSERC, and CIHR), and successfully funding for your research idea.
